Principal – BBQ's & sink for BBQ upgrade
Fishing Club – 1 x 8hp two stroke Yamaha outboard

TOTAL FUNDS ALLOCATED - \$9,083

This means that the combined funds given back to the school to assist with our children's education/wellbeing from the Canteen and the P&C totalled \$49,083 for 2017!

The YAHS P&C have purchased two wheel trolley's for our Volunteers to use for any P&C activities. These are kept in the P&C Shed behind the Canteen.




GOVERNESS ... WHO? WHAT? WHEN?

WHO? A governess is someone who is employed by a family to help with the care and education of their children. The children attend school through either a Distance Education School (DE) or School Of The Air (SOTA).

WHAT? Roles of the governess are many and varied from helping with the care of the children to delivery of lessons in a home based schoolroom on rural, remote and very remote properties via leaflets and satellite lessons from either school.

WHEN? Student Injury Insurance

Did you know that the YAHS P&C Assoc annually pays for Student Injury Insurance for all our enrolled students through the P&C Federation?

This cover is not restricted to school operating hours but provides 24 hours a day, 7 days a week cover - even at home or at a family events. The cover isn't just for broken bones and ambulance trips but also covers dental and non-Medicare medical expenses and small property losses.

All school excursions/activities are covered and ambulance cover is Australia wide. Claims can be made directly through the P&C Federation. Visit the P&C Federation website for further information.

Are you travelling to Sydney for medical appointments? Do you need transport or accommodation?

Country Care Link has been assisting rural families since 1992. The Service provides support and hospitality to country people visiting Sydney for medical purposes. This no-cost service provides transport to country people who are attending medical visits or a hospital stay in Sydney. Transport is provided by trained volunteer drivers on either arrival or departure between the airport, railway or bus station and their medical appointment, hospital or accommodation. The service can also provide information on accommodation close to many hospitals in Sydney.
